Nursing Programs

Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing

Our Bachelor's degree program emphasizes practice-based knowledge. To earn a baccalaureate degree in nursing, you'll complete 64 hours of nursing courses and 64 hours of academic studies outside the nursing major.

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree prepares an entry-level nurse to deliver care to patients across the life span in a variety of settings. Graduates are eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensing Examination (NCLEX) for attainment of professional licensure as a registered nurse.

In addition to preparing nurses to provide skillful care in a variety of settings, a baccalaureate education also provides the foundation for graduate studies and advanced nursing practice.

RN to BSN Completion Option

The BryanLGH College of Health Sciences RN to BSN Completion Option offers you many advantages – credit for your prior learning and nursing experience, flexibility in when you begin your program, and high quality faculty and facilities to expand your nursing perspectives.

As a registered nurse, you'll receive 36 credit hours toward the required 64 nursing major credit hours, plus the opportunity to use your clinical practice experience in the workplace toward the remaining 28 nursing major credit hours. College transcripts will be reviewed to determine general education requirements you have met that can be applied toward the general education credit hour requirement.

General Education

BryanLGH College of Health Sciences offers all general education coursework required in the School of Nursing curriculum, providing students the convenience of taking their courses within a learning community they know and value.

General Education courses at the College aim to expand students' world view. Courses in the natural sciences, social sciences, communications, mathematics/economics, and humanities/fine arts provide students with a broad-based understanding of the human condition that will complement and enhance their professional and personal lives.

Admission

To be considered for admission, please submit the following items:

- Completed application form.
- Official High School Transcript and grading scale (sent directly from your high school or district office).
- ACT or SAT scores (writing scores are not required for ACT/SAT).
- Official College/University Transcript(s), if you have attended college/university. Transcripts from institutions outside Nebraska require course descriptions to be submitted for review (sent directly from the college).
- Three references.
- Qualified applicants will be offered an interview after the above required items are submitted.

Bachelor of Science in Nursing applications should be completed no later than February 1 for Fall entry and June 1 for Spring Entry. Classes enter at both the Fall and Spring terms.

The RN to BSN Completion Option runs on a rolling admissions, applications are reviewed throughout the year for Fall, Spring and Summer entry, there are no specific deadlines.
