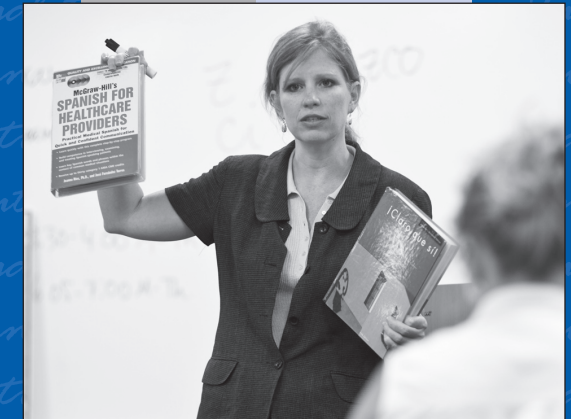

## General Education Courses

At BryanLGH College of Health Sciences our General Education courses:

- Ensure individual attention and close interactions between faculty and students with small class sizes, usually under 25 students per course.
- Provide a breadth of knowledge that helps students become well-rounded, critical thinkers to prepare for courses in their major.
- Encourage a focus on healthcare issues – reinforcing the College’s belief that General Education coursework prepares students for the diverse circumstances and experiences they will encounter within their major and their profession.

## Unique Experiences

The College’s General Education courses strive to provide innovative, interdisciplinary learning experiences that challenge students to be the best student learners – and the best healthcare professionals – they can be. Here are some examples:

- Students in Anatomy and Physiology and Pathophysiology courses expand their study to include content that will impact their clinical experience.
- Students in Healthcare Economics study the relationship between the current health insurance crisis in the United States and how it will affect their future role in the healthcare industry.
- Students in courses such as Ethics in Healthcare, Comparative Religion, Global Community, Human Growth and Development, and Introduction to Sociology hear from

speakers in the healthcare arena who discuss how General Education concepts have affected their professional lives.

## Faculty

General Education faculty members are experts in their field committed to offering the one-on-one, personalized attention for which our College is known. General Education faculty hold appropriate credentials, are active and committed scholars, and have a clear understanding of the relationship between General Education content and the healthcare field.

## Frequently Asked Questions

- Q.** Why should I take my General Education courses at the College of Health Sciences? Aren't there less expensive options at other institutions?
- A.** Some institutions may offer less expensive versions of the “same course,” but in fact there are not other institutions in the city that offer General Education with a focus on healthcare. Our General Education courses provide breadth of coverage while relating content to issues and ideas affecting professionals in the fields of nursing and allied health. Moreover, our courses are small, our faculty are accessible and our student services are designed to meet the specific needs of students enrolled at the College.
- Q.** Can I take all of my General Education courses at the College?
- A.** Yes. All required and prerequisite courses needed to enter the allied health and nursing majors are offered onsite.
- Q.** What are some of the advantages of taking my General Education courses at the College?
- A.** Students who complete their General Education courses at the College develop valuable relationships with faculty and students that provide continuity, support and guidance throughout their course of study. And, whenever possible, our General Education courses include discussions and activities relating to issues of particular interest to healthcare professionals.
- Q.** Does the College accept General Education coursework completed at other degree-granting institutions?
- A.** Yes. Prospective and current students are invited to consult with the Registrar or Admissions Office staff members to learn how to apply for credit for previously completed coursework and/or dual credit at the College.
